SO DEEP-ROOTED IS CASTE MALAISE THAT FOR MANY DALITS IN AN UJJAIN VILLAGE IT IS A TRADITION TO KEEP

Kadachha (Ujjain), May 6

IN KADACHHA village like in many others in Madhya Pradesh, social discrimination has become a way of life, with Dalits and Other Backward Classes (OBCs) accepting it as a tradition to be followed.

A visit to this village in Ujjain district (adjoining Indore) — that shot into the limelight following an HT report based on the findings of NGO Jan Sahas and Unicef on caste discrimination in serving of mid-day meals and care of pregnant and postpartum Dalit women — showed how deep-rooted the malaise is.

A schoolteacher belonging to the Dalit community said on condition of anonymity fearing further victimisation, "I have experienced it all my life. We can't mount a horse at marriage processions. We can't celebrate in upper caste localities with drums and the like. We have to get off a cycle if an elderly person from the upper caste is close by. The list is endless."

"But what can an individual do when the practice is accepted even by members of the reserved class. If I make a hue and cry over the issue, the elders in my own community will gag me," he said.

Ignorant of the stigma attached to the practice, Lekha (only name mentioned), a standard V student said, "We have always been sitting in separate rows for mid-day meals. Is it bad?" When informed that it

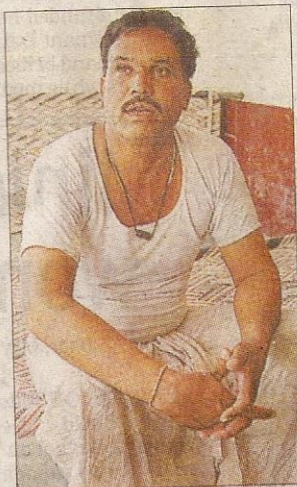

was a violation of his rights, the schoolboy said, "My father never told me this."

The sarpanch (headman) of the village, Balaram Jaat, went to the extent of defending the discrimination. "No one tells Dalits to refrain from eating at public functions with the upper caste people or remain outside the houses of Brahmins or Rajputs. They do it on their

NHRC asks for report in 4 weeks

Panel to send probe team to four districts

TAKING COGNISANCE of Hindustan Times reports on discrimination against Dalit children and women in Madhya Pradesh, the National Human Rights Commission on Wednesday issued notice to the state Chief Secretary asking him to send a report within four weeks. The Commission also decided to depute its investigation team to visit Jhabua, Sheopur, Katni and Ujjain — the places mentioned in the reports — to conduct an on-the-spot inquiry.

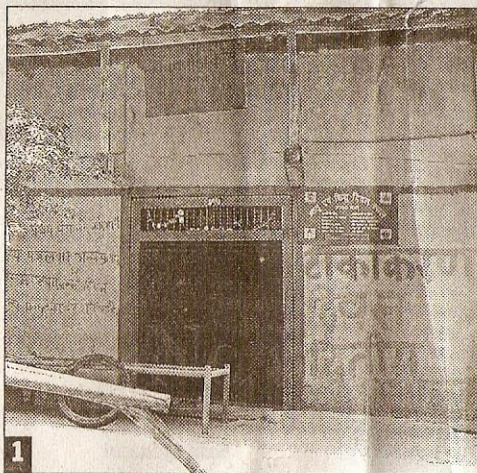
The team has been asked to submit its report within four weeks, the NHRC said.

In a series of reports, HT exposed how Dalit kids are being discriminated against in four districts - Jhabua, Sheopur, Katni and Ujjain of Madhya Pradesh.

The reports also exposed that the health workers in these districts avoided Dalit hamlets and examined women without touching them.

The Commission said, "The reports, if true, raise serious issue of violation of human rights of Dalits." According to the reports based on a survey by Jansahas, an NGO, and UNICEF government-funded health workers often refuse to treat pregnant Dalit women and when they do, they demand bribes and then refuse to touch the patients while medically examining them.

own. They feel it is a tradition that has to be kept alive." Among the 900-odd people living in the village, nearly 90 per cent belong to the Scheduled Caste and Other Backward Classes. Some Brahmins and Rajputs also live in the village. The localities of the upper caste and the Dalits are clearly defined.

The headman claimed that the upper caste people have been living here for generations. "How can they (upper castes) be asked to leave their traditional homes and construct houses in other localities?" He implied that as long as the upper castes live in locality, the tradition of subservience should be followed.

Government-funded health workers often refuse to treat pregnant Dalit women.

When they do, they demand bribes and then refuse to touch the patients while medically examining them. Even injections are administered without touching the women.

A survey by Jansahas, an NGO, and Unicef reveals these, and other, gruesome cases of caste discrimination in four districts — Jhabua, Sheopur, Katni and Ujjain —in Madhya Pradesh. *Hindustan Times* reported this first on Tuesday in a report titled Apartheid funded by the Indian tax-payer.

The survey has revealed that assistant nursing matrons (ANMs) or Asha Workers, who are responsible for delivering government-funded health benefits to poor people, seldom visit dalit localities. When they do, they don't touch pregnant Dalit women while medically examining them.

And finally, Dalit women have to pay a major part of the monetary benefits they receive under the government's Janani Suraksha Yojana (Mother Protection Scheme) as bribes to these ANMs and, sometimes, even to doctors.

The ANMs visit the villages once a month without intimation and examine pregnant women only in Anganwadi centres. "Since most of the Anganwadi centres are run from the homes of upper caste peoples, Dalit women, who are denied entry into these, are deprived of any medical attention," Jan Sahas activist Ashif Sheikh told Hindustan Times.

In cases where they do receive treatment, Dalit women are the last to be examined — after the last non-dalit woman has left.

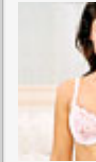
Then, even injections are administered without touching them, the survey showed. Injections administered in this manner increase the possibility of the needles breaking, thus, exposing the patients to medical complications.

"As many as 42 per cent of the young Dalit mothers surveyed claimed that they avoided visiting the Anganwadi centres

because of caste discrimination," he said, adding that 96 per cent of Dalit women surveyed said they had experience some form of discrimination, the most common being casteist abuses.

Around 23 per cent of Dalit women are deprived of the monetary benefits they are entitled to under the government's Janani Suraksha Yojana.

"Legally, they are entitled to free medical care during deliveries, but in practice, 86 per cent of Dalit women had to spend money," said Sheikh.

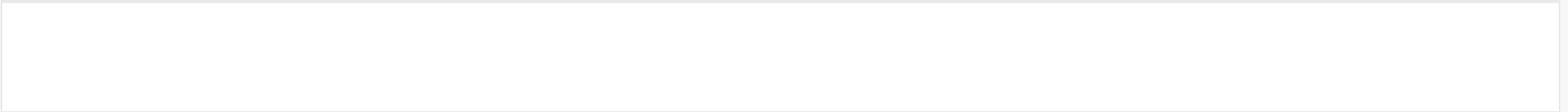
